Course Description:

World History to 1500 is a course that explores the historical connections, continuities, and discontinuities among key technological, economic, and cultural developments across the globe. Students will learn about how cities were formed and grew into empires, what it took to maintain centers of power, forms of leadership, cultural achievement, and notions of truth and authority. In the end, the class will enable students to form educated evaluations on society, politics, and public life.

Course Objectives:

This course improves analytical reasoning, evidence-based argumentation, and teaches close reading. Students will also learn how to interpret and write historical and ethnographic studies.
